Our Location

Set in 130 acres of beautiful grounds, located only 35 minutes from London, Bishop's Stortford College is a co-educational day and boarding school for students aged 3 to 18.



Bishop's Stortford is a historic market town in Hertfordshire. It is situated between two cities; 23 miles north is the city of Cambridge, and 27 miles south is central London. This central location means the town is well connected to the rest of the UK via both road and rail network, and internationally with London Stansted Airport under five miles away, and other London airports

within easy access.



A Day in the Life

Life as a boarder is always really busy.
Everyone is up by 7.00am during the week,
ready for breakfast in the Dining Hall at
7.30am. Thankfully the Dining Hall is only
a short walk from the boarding houses, so not
too far for us to go.

Our Houses are mixed with day and boarding students, so day students start to arrive about 8.00am, before roll call at 8.15am. The days are then full with lessons, games, assemblies, clubs and clinics, through until 4.45pm, when the school day finishes.

Once we have said goodbye to the day students, boarders have the campus to themselves, and can spend the evening together relaxing, or visiting the local town.

Supper is served at 5.45pm, after which we have another roll call, and set time for homework. Once this is

finished at 8.30pm however, we have more free time, and boarders have sole access to the sports hall, tennis courts, the gym, and the music rooms, which is great.

Everyone has to be back in their House by 10.00pm, and depending on your year group, lights out starts from 9.45pm for Year 9s.

No two days are ever the same as there's always so much on offer. You can choose however how much, or little of it, you want to get involved with.



British Culture Programme

Our British culture programme for boarders at weekends brings together a mixture of new skills, fun, and team building activities, both on and off campus, to enrich their time at the College.

It has been designed to ensure boarders are engaged and kept busy at weekends, but with enough down time built in to rest.

The programme provides a balance between sports match representation on a Saturday (for squad members), off site trips, on campus social activities, and relaxation. At points during the year, Saturdays also provide opportunities for exam revision and preparing university applications, supported by academic staff.

Our off-site trips focus on British culture, fun, and resilience building. They include experiences across opera, theatre, and museums, as well as visits to UK cities, such as London and Cambridge, coastal

seaside towns, and theme parks.
There are sporting opportunities,
where new sports such as skiing and
sailing can be learnt, and premier
football matches can be watched.

These carefully planned activities are designed to complement students' academic experiences and ensure their time with us is both rewarding and unforgettable.

SIXTH AT THE COLLEGE


Sixth at the College is a place of inspiration, where you will join a community of talented, determined, and compassionate students.

Summer School and Sports Camps

Bishop's Stortford College International Summer School is open to international students aged eight to 17 years who visit the UK for two weeks in the summer. The College also hosts a number of sports camps throughout the year, run by specialist sports providers.



At Summer School we welcome groups of students aged eight to 17 accompanied by one or more Group Leaders, and individual students aged 13 to 17. The courses combine English language tuition, general or specialist activities and classes, events, local visits and excursions to places of historical and cultural interest.

Child Student visa sponsorship

International students who require a visa to study in the UK can apply for a Child Student visa with our sponsorship. We sponsor students who are boarding with us full-time.

Guardians

All international students on a Child Student visa are required to have an appropriate Guardian whilst in the UK. Please see our website for further details.

English support

Our English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) team provide English language support on an individual or group basis, for every day, social, and academic purposes.

Boarding Students Connect

We understand that moving overseas or boarding for the first time can be daunting. Our fun and welcoming induction programme for all new boarders, held the week prior to the start of term in September, helps students settle in smoothly.

Short-term places

We offer short-term stays (one term to one year) for international students, offering them the chance to experience life at a British boarding school; either as a standalone experience or before committing to a longer-term stay.



ADMISSIONS

Application and Scholarships

Our friendly Admissions team are here to help with the application process. We are an academically selective school, and all students will take part in our entry assessments.

Boarders can join the College in:

Year 9 (pre-testers-UK only)

UK Year 9 (13+) (Grade 8)

UK Year 10 (14+) (Grade 9)

Applia

UK Year 12 (16+) for A Level (Grade 11) Applicants will complete tests in English, mathematics, reasoning, and an interview.

Applicants will complete tests in English, reasoning, mathematics (if choosing mathematics, a science, or economics or business A Level), and an interview.



For those students where English is not their first language, applicants will be asked to complete an ESOL written assessment and interview.

Students applying for a short-term place will be assessed via an ESOL interview and an online reasoning test.

We are a UKiset school, so students can take their assessments via UKiset, or directly with us; either online, or at the College if the applicant is at school in the UK.
